

## Instructions for How to Write on this Site

Congratulations, you have decided to publish your article on Science Doubt. You have made an intrepid decision considering the previous treatment afforded others who have swum “up-stream” of the science community. Your next decision in this matter is very important.

Do you intend to write with your true identification posted to the public or are you going to remain anonymous and publish using a pseudonym?

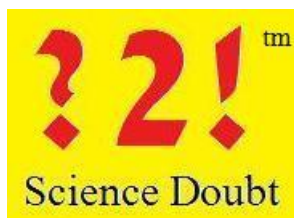
Writing under your true identity allows you to freely accept accolades immediately and brag, if you will; however, with this notoriety comes the personal attacks, potential damage to your reputation, possible loss of funding, and/or dismissal from your current position. Therefore, Science Doubt recommends that you chose to utilize its system of anonymous publication.

O.K. you have chosen to write under a pseudonym, now what?

Just follow the simple steps outlined below, that are designed to give you total control over the dissemination of your true identity. Remember, do not skip any of these, they are extremely important.

1 – Purchase a zip drive and transfer all of your notes, files, drafts, images, figures, and articles to it. Ensure that none of this information remains on any computer that you do not maintain total control of at all times. Scour any computer you have access to for any information that may connect you to your thoughts.

2 – Find a Proxy Server that you are comfortable with using. You can do a search of the net for one or just use Anonymizer.com. You will need to use this proxy server when ever you are going to connect with the internet, including when connecting to e-mail. Use of the proxy server is not required when surfing Science Doubt; however, it is recommended when doing any research or other knowledge gathering.



3 – Pick a pseudonym to write under. Ensure that it is professional sounding and worthy of publication. Cute user-names have no place in this step. Do a search of the internet to ensure that the name you have chosen is not the true identity of someone already associated with your topic. Science Doubt will annotate your pseudonym as such on all web pages connected with your work. Example: Article by John Smith (pseudonym). This will ensure that readers understand that the true identity of the author is not affiliated with the article for public knowledge.

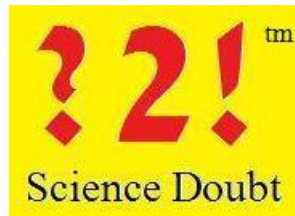
4 – Choose an E-Mail Provider to use. Google's Gmail and Yahoo are examples.

5 – Sign up for e-mail through your chosen provider using the pseudonym of your choice. Gmail allows you to look for the availability of your e-mail address. You may want to complete this step at the same time you are choosing your pseudonym.

At this point, you are the only one who knows that you are writing under the pseudonym that you have chosen. Do not tell anyone that you can not trust with your life. Including Science Doubt. It should stay this way until you are receiving recognition that is afforded an accepted theory, i.e. the work is now used in mainstream science or they want to give you the Noble Prize. Until that time, public knowledge of your identity can be risky.

It is now time to make first contact with Science Doubt. Just send a simple e-mail using your new pseudonym's address to the editor at [sciencedoubt.com](mailto:sciencedoubt.com) expressing your desire to use the service. You will receive a return e-mail explaining what will be required as far as formats for file delivery.

Do not make mention of your true identity in your correspondence with Science Doubt. There is no need for Science Doubt to know exactly who you are and there is no desire to, until your work has become accepted. Your e-mails, using your pseudonym, will be considered your identity and signature for the purposes of copyrights. Should you later desire to make your true identity public, a series of e-mails and personal contacts will confirm your intent. Until then, you will remain totally anonymous.



For those of you that are comfortable with writing publicly using your true identity can just send an e-mail to Science Doubt to make initial contact. The above steps are designed to protect those that are in a high risk category.
